

## 1 0 Maklumat Umum Tuntutan Wang Tak Dituntut Tuntutan

Fenomena politik baharu yang bermula semenjak PRU-10 1999 dilihat terus mencorakkan trend pengundian dalam PRU-13 yang berlangsung pada Mei 2013. Walaupun sedemikian, fenomena sebegini bukanlah trend yang konsisten jika dilihat dari dua sudut iaitu faktor yang mendukung gagasan ini dan juga pembalikan politik lama yang berlaku selepas sesuatu PRU. Penerusan pergeseran antara politik baharu dengan politik lama ini merupakan antara inti pati yang mendasari analisis di sembilan buah negeri yang terlibat dalam PRU-13 yang lalu. Pilihan raya yang disifatkan sebagai “ibu segala pilihan raya” ini ternyata memberikan paradoks kepada kedua-dua pihak yang bertanding iaitu Barisan Nasional dan Pakatan Rakyat yang “kalah dalam menang dan menang dalam kalah”. Biarpun keputusan PRU-13 terus menghantar mesej yang politik baharu tetap menjadi taruhan dan pilihan, perkembangan selepas PRU-13 menyarankan yang kedua-dua pihak semakin cenderung untuk kembali ke politik lama demi mengimbangi tuntutan perjuangan masing-masing.

Peletz deepens our knowledge of Islamic political development in a country very much concerned with forging an Islamic modernity viewed by its leaders as a viable alternative to Western-style modernization.

Malaysia's multicultural society supports one of the most dynamic economies in Asia. This completely revised new edition of the standard text, first published twenty years ago, traces the history of the country from early times to the present day. The authors give particular attention to the evolution of Malay polities and their close links with indigenous groups who lived on the oceans and in the deep jungles of the region, from Sumatra to Borneo. This provides the background to the establishment of the Malay port of Melaka, which was conquered by the Portuguese in 1511, foreshadowing the establishment of a British colonial regime in the late nineteenth century. Although the large numbers of Chinese and Indian migrants who arrived to work in the tin and rubber industries contributed to economic expansion, colonial policies did not encourage communal interaction. The authors trace the process by which post-independence leaders in Malaya attempted to counter the legacy of ethnic hostility while answering Malay demands for an affirmation of their rights and a stronger commitment to Islam. The incorporation of the Borneo states of Sarawak and Sabah into the Federation of Malaysia in 1963 rendered the goal of welding a nation from areas that were

geographically separated and culturally disparate even more problematic. The intense emotions attached to issues of race were made tragically evident in the racial riots of May 1969, which this book sees as a watershed in modern Malaysian history. As Malaysia enters the twenty-first century, the government is determined to oversee the transition to an economy focused on manufacturing and advanced technology, and to eliminate poverty and the association between occupation and race. While several recent studies deal with the impact of colonial rule and Malaysia's spectacular economic transition, this book is unique because it tracks developments from early times and identifies continuities as well as change. Combining the authors' specialist knowledge of precolonial sources with the most recent contemporary research, this new edition reinforces the position of *A History of Malaysia* position as a standard reference for all those interested in the historical processes which led to the emergence of this culturally varied and economically energetic country.

Debate on freedom of religion as a human right takes place not only in the Western

world but also in Muslim communities throughout the world. For Muslims concerned for this freedom, one of the major difficulties is the 'punishment for apostasy' - death for those who desert Islam. This book argues that the law of apostasy and its punishment by death in Islamic law is untenable in the modern period. Apostasy conflicts with a variety of foundation texts of Islam and with the current ethos of human rights, in particular the freedom to choose one's religion. Demonstrating the early development of the law of apostasy as largely a religio-political tool, the authors show the diversity of opinion among early Muslims on the punishment, highlighting the substantial ambiguities about what constitutes apostasy, the problematic nature of some of the key textual evidence on which the punishment of apostasy is based, and the neglect of a vast amount of clear Qur'anic texts in favour of freedom of religion in the construction of the law of apostasy. Examining the significant challenges the punishment of apostasy faces in the modern period inside and outside Muslim communities - exploring in particular how apostasy and its punishment is dealt with in a multi-religious Muslim majority country, Malaysia, and the challenges and difficulties it faces there - the authors discuss arguments by prominent Muslims today for an absolute freedom of religion and for discarding the punishment of apostasy.

This text examines the development and practice of Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism and Christianity in Malaysia. Its analyses provide an insight into how established and charismatic religions fit into the framework of modernization and secularization

throughout the world.
