Each chapter follows a consistent format: Presenting Problems and Client Description; Diagnosis and Case Formulation; Course of Treatment; Outcome and Prognosis/Treatment Follow-up; and Discussion Questions. Providing empirically supported treatments and long-term follow-up in many case studies gives students a deeper understanding of each psychopathology and the effects of treatment over time.

How the Case Studies are Structured Each case is presented in depth, with a full chapter devoted to each patient. Many cases include excerpts of dialog from therapy interviews. Each case is compared with DSM-IV diagnostic

criteria for relevant disorders. Some treatment failures are presented as well as successes. New discussions are provided concerning gender-related issues such as the impact of rape and sexual abuse, as well as relational distress and depression. All cases end with a discussion of etiology and treatment that illustrates the application of research to individual clients' problems, and alerts readers to important gaps in our knowledge of abnormal psychology.
