

Daily Oral Language Grade 2 180 Lessons And 18 Assessments Daily Series

Based in case studies conducted in the US, Europe, and Latin America, this book explores the feasibility and benefits of trilingual/ multilingual education in the United States. Currently, there are few programs in the country of this nature, as educators tend to conclude that English-language learners would be overwhelmed by study in additional languages. Henn-Reinke builds an argument supporting trilingual education in the US, discussing issues of identity, curriculum, pedagogy, and the impact of other psycho-socio-linguistic factors.

Each book provides five items (four items for grade 1) for every day of a 36-week school year, presented in a standardized-testing format. For the teacher there are scope-and-sequence charts, suggestions for use, and answer keys.

It is the intent of this program that students have the opportunity to practice proof-reading skills under the direction of their teacher and ultimately utilize these skills within their own writing.

The pages are reproducible and the book includes a skills list and answer keys.
