She gave hundreds of lectures in schools and colleges in America and, when the war ended, she worked as a Child Welfare Officer in UNRRA displaced persons' camps in Germany. In 1949 she married the American Vogue photographer Don Honeyman and settled in London, where they brought up a son and a daughter and where she began her career as a journalist. Her books include: *The Medallion*, a novel; *The Invisible Children*, on child prostitution; *Into That Darkness*; and a biographical examination of Albert Speer. Gitta Sereny died in June 2012.
