

Jazz Guitar With Classical Techniqu Volume 2

World famous guitarist and educator Benjamin Verdery has compiled standard repertoire pieces as well as new pieces for classical guitar. Performance tips are clearly presented for the beginning player. Information is included on how to prepare and present a recital and tips are provided on technique, interpretation, practicing and dealing with performance anxiety. Features new pieces by Benjamin Verdery, Anthony Newman, Frederic Hand and others as well as important music from the standard repertoire. The CD includes performances of each piece in the book.

Classically trained jazz guitarist Diego Barber presents five well-developed themes and a 3-movement solo sonata transcribed from his outstanding commercial CD recordings: Calima, One Minute Later, Tales, and The Choice. Two of the tracks, Elvira Maria and the 3-movement Sonata Banc d'Arguin are strictly guitar solos, while Richi is a solo accompanied by light percussion. Kilian's Mountain is a reduced score of an extended duet with a pianist, and Desierto and Virgianna include expert sidemen on saxophone, bass and drums. The music ventures from complex melody-chord textures to hard-swinging grooves, all played with spontaneity and a heightened awareness of time, dynamics, color, technique and tone. Even seasoned guitarists will find these pieces rhythmically and technically challenging, but they provide a roadmap to the recordings, and rare insight to the workings of a unique musical mind. Diego Barber's Compositions for Classical Guitar are written in standard notation only, with online access to stellar solo and ensemble recordings. About Sonata Banc d'Arguin É Diego Barber is a native of Lanzarote in the Canary Islands, just off the northeast coast of Africa; in writing Sonata Banc d'Arguin, the main solo piece in this collection, he was inspired by the major cities, Nouadhibou and Nouakchott, the Banc d'Arguin National Park, and the desert of the West African country of Mauritania.

Although this is a book of exercises rather than a method, I have included many helpful tips throughout the book to aid students. As with all my materials, the video lessons are an added educational advantage. Intended for beginner to early-advanced classical guitar students (approximately RCM Toronto Grade 1-9). As a basic prerequisite students would have completed both Volume One and Two of my beginner method book series or an equivalent. There are a number of exercises in upper positions that include accidentals, therefore, additional reading experience is required if you wish to study the entire book. The inclusion of fingering, string numbers, and position marks should make the exercises easy to understand. The 100 open string exercises should be very accessible to beginners and advanced students alike.

There are no additional slurs or markings of any kind. Thoughts on Practice The benefits of practicing Bach's compositions in all keys are numerous, some obvious, and others perhaps surprising. After practicing these pieces in various keys, you may find that: Harmonic progressions and cadences become easier to hear and to understand, especially as you encounter familiar structures in unfamiliar keys. As you become more comfortable with the compositions, you will begin to anticipate fingerings in new keys,

playing by ear; an increasingly strong sense of relative pitch will begin to lead your hands. It is extremely valuable to play the same single movement for an extended practice session in multiple (at least three, preferably five or more) different keys (back to back). This side-by-side approach will shed further light on the inner workings of Bach's harmonic progressions and melodic design. There is great benefit in devising new fingerings suitable for each particular key, rather than merely shifting the same finger patterns up or down the fretboard. Break out of positional playing by employing open strings; connect positions by playing motives or melodic designs along single strings. The duets are nice yet challenging works which help to develop small ensemble performance skills and sight reading and can be played by teacher and student.

When improvising, what your mind hears is more often than not determined by what your body can reproduce on your instrument. Much of your conception as an improviser is determined by your technique.
