This book is a metaphorical journey through the English lexicon, viewed as a vehicle and a mirror of cultural identity. In later years, however, she became a prominent figure within the Catholic Enlightenment, gave up the academic world, and devoted herself to the poor, the sick, the hungry, and the homeless.
