Fortunatamente ai romani e ai ristoratori locali tale giudizio entra da un orecchio ed esce dall'altro. E' certo infatti che agli eredi di Romolo è sempre piaciuto mangiar bene e ciò è una garanzia. Nel XXI secolo, la globalizzazione ha integrato la cucina locale con menu di scuole differenti, provenienti da tutte le regioni d'Italia e dal resto del Mondo; quindi, ce n'è per tutti i gusti. Nella presente guida, l'autore ha compilato, dopo una quarantennale esperienza diretta, 391 schede di altrettanti esercizi gastronomici della capitale, descrivendone i menu, le particolarità e attribuendo ad ognuno un voto prezzo e un voto qualità. Lo scopo è quello di dimostrare che nella Capitale si può non solo mangiar bene ma anche a buon mercato. Se ci sia riuscito o meno, ai lettori – o meglio – ai commensali l'ardua sentenza. Secondo l'autore, la regola principale è quella di affidarsi alla "saggezza della folla": alla larga dai locali vuoti o semivuoti. La preferenza va data a quelli affollati, anche restando qualche minuto in attesa o magari prenotando in anticipo, perché il loro affollamento è sicuramente dovuto all'ottimo rapporto qualità/prezzo. Roma è sempre stata la somma di insediamenti e di esperienze diverse che hanno contribuito alla formazione di variegate atmosfere, culturali ma anche gastronomiche, che si trascinano tuttora. Da secoli non c'è più un solo "centro storico", con la sua piazza principale (quello che un tempo era il Foro) ma, dal secondo dopoguerra, vi sono anche tante periferie, con la loro storia e le loro culture. Non si è potuto rinunciare, perciò, alla differenziazione degli esercizi in base alla loro localizzazione, anche perché, data l'estensione ormai raggiunta dall'abitato, la domanda: "cosa vogliamo mangiare?" oggi, è preceduta da quella, forse più appropriata: "dove si va a mangiare?" Talvolta le zone sono state accoppiate, per comodità di lettura, specificando – se necessario – la loro differenziazione socio-culturale. Dovendo riassumere in un'unica cifra le caratteristiche principali dei locali e, onde evitare l'influenza delle impressioni soggettive, l'autore ha individuato parametri standard, al fine di ottenere il risultato il più possibile vicino alla realtà, per l'espressione dei voti, riguardanti sia il prezzo che la qualità dei locali. Il lettore di questa guida, infine, tenga presente che le bellezze di Roma si apprezzano meglio seduti a una buona tavola; in particolare, se si ha la fortuna di trovare un tavolino all'esterno. Soprattutto, l'autore è assolutamente convinto che in nessun altro luogo come nelle trattorie si può conoscere la straordinaria vitalità del popolo romano.

Many students of Spanish literature will have encountered some of Góngora's poems. No Spanish poet is grater or more rewarding, but few are as difficult for the beginner. His style is a habit of mind: radically metaphorical, elliptical, witty, highly sensuous, transmuting the world of the sense into a world of the spirit. To read him, one has to learn these characteristic habits and perform athletic mental feats as one goes along. It would be too easy to say that Professor Jones has made Góngora 'easy'; but he has certainly made him more accessible. A long introduction briefly deals with Góngora's life, and then gives solid critical guidance to the poems. It includes passages of sustained and detailed analysis which explain how characteristic poems 'work' and it incorporates original insights and research. The notes are full and are designed to help the reader through the difficulties by offering critical comment.

The first short story collection from the acclaimed non-fiction writer contains eight stories, six of which were originally published in the New Yorker. From a mildly troubled adolescent who moves from innocence to experience over the course of a summer with his estranged mother ("Hard to Be Good") to a former rock musician protecting himself against the bitterness of a failed romance ("Too Much Electricity"), Barich treats his characters with loving empathy and gentle humor. His eye for the specific and the delightful ease of his prose style allow him to find the extraordinary in the lives of ordinary Americans.

He has published more than 200 papers, essays, and book chapters and edited several books. Dr. Lee is a peer reviewer for numerous scientific and medical journals.
