

Philippine Law School Admission Test Cem Inc

This 80 volume set covers landmark constitutional law cases from 1793 through 1973. Supplemental volumes are available through the 1986 term. The reader is provided with the circumstances that influence the decisions of the justices and that form the factual foundation of each of the included cases.

Examines the law and politics surrounding the Bakke case; a case claiming reverse discrimination, considered by many as the most important civil rights decision since the end of segregation.

More than 180 ABA-approved law schools across the United States are described, with information on admission requirements, degree requirements, tuition and fees, sources of financial aid, and career placement services. The book also features 20 pages in table form listing each law school with statistics on its median LSAT (Law School Admission Test) scores and other admission requirements, thus enabling candidates to estimate in advance their chances of admission to each school. Also helpful are a general overview of law school curricula and a brief description of selected non-ABA-approved schools. A sample LSAT is included with answers and explanations.
