This report presents the findings from the social capital section of the General Household Survey 2000/01. This

The guide covers the process from signing and excavating issues to reinstating and leaving the finished site, and for each section information is given on specification details and key tasks, as well as health and safety issues.

Asphalt Surfacing has been written as a reference to the various asphalt course materials and surfacing treatments that are currently available to engineers,

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enabling them to select the materials and/or treatment that are appropriate for use on specific sites. Appropriate reference is made to the lower structural layers as the properties of all layers interact in producing the required pavement. The current established position in the UK and the emerging developments throughout the UK and Europe are covered. This edition incorporates an expanded section on ancillary activities such as road markings, and new performance specification for compaction (including void content measurement).

Students will find this text fully caters for the requirements of BTEC National and NVQ qualifications in construction, civil engineering and highways maintenance. In addition, content has been matched to the specifications of the new Higher Nationals in Civil Engineering from Edexcel.

Professionals will find the new edition to be an invaluable up-to-date reference source, especially of relevance to recent graduates new to the work place.

This code of practice sets out the statutory requirements for materials, performance and standards of workmanship for use in association with street works by utilities and other undertakers with apparatus in the street. It applies in England only and comes into effect on 1 October 2010, when it replaces the 2nd edition (2002, ISBN 9780115525384).

In recent years, highway maintenance has become a high profile topic, owing to the greater travel potential of the general public and to the impact of roadworks on commerce following the swing away from rail transport. Highway maintenance was once a low-key activity, but it is now being treated as an important consideration in the

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overall cost of providing the nation's infrastructure.

Roads have assumed an increasingly important role in this process, particularly during the past 30 years as a result of the motorway building programme.

This, the first of two volumes, gives a comprehensive treatment of the civil engineering work relating to sewers and emphasises the practical aspects of repair and renovation. A considerable amount of theoretical work already exists on this subject. However this book is unique in meeting the engineer's need for up-to-date information on the application of theory and incorporates some important recent developments in the field. The technical aspects of survey and access are dealt with in some detail and the book also provides fundamental data on hydraulics, structural assessment and the use of the Wallingford Storm Sewer Package.

Under art. 31 of the Street Works (Northern Ireland) Order 1995, companies executing street works must comply with prescribed specifications when reinstating the street, in relation to materials used and standards of workmanship. This is the second edition of this publication which sets out guidance on the reinstatement standards required, and new features include new British Standards (in support of European standards) for asphalt materials covering composition and binder contents, new procedures for chalk materials, a new section on the use of sustainable alternative reinstatement materials and on specialist surfacing materials. This edition will come into operation on 1 October 2006 when it will supersede the first edition (ISBN 0337083797).
