THE FOUR HORSEMEN OF THE APOCALYPSE Apocalyptic writings; Jewish and Christian writings were composed between 200BC and 100AD. Both religions believe in two opposing cosmic powers; one being good, the other being evil. The belief is that these times are irredeemably ruled by Satan, a cosmic power personifying pure evil. A characteristic foretelling or ascribing these times by earlier prophets or saints; led today's believers to interpretate our present day, being near the end times. Anna Emma Carroll the "silent member" of Abraham Lincoln's cabinet resided here along with other notables such as Annie Oakley, Harriet Tubman, John Barth and Bea Arthur.
