

## The Mermaids Revenge

Kernowland 4 Pigleg's Revenge is the fourth book in the Kernowland in Erthwurd series by Jack Trelawny. Tizzie was in big trouble at the end of Book 3. A century before psychoanalytic discourse codified a scientific language to describe the landscape of the mind, Johann Wolfgang von Goethe explored the paradoxes of an interior self separate from a conscious self. Though long acknowledged by the developers of depth psychology and by its historians, Goethe's literary rendering of interiority has not been the subject of detailed analysis in itself. Goethe's *Allegories of Identity* examines how Goethe created the essential bridge between the psychological insights of his contemporary, Jean-Jacques Rousseau, and the psychoanalytic theories of his admirer Sigmund Freud. Equally fascinated and repelled by Rousseau's vision of an unconscious self, Goethe struggled with the moral question of subjectivity: what is the relation of conscience to consciousness? To explore this inner conflict through language, Goethe developed a unique mode of allegorical representation that modernized the long tradition of dramatic personification in European drama. Jane K. Brown's deft, focused readings of Goethe's major dramas and novels, from *The Sorrows of Young Werther* to *Elective Affinities*, reveal each text's engagement with the concept of a subconscious or unconscious psyche whose workings are largely inaccessible to the rational mind. As Brown demonstrates, Goethe's representational strategies fashioned a language of subjectivity that deeply influenced the conceptions of important twentieth-century thinkers such as Freud, Michel Foucault, and Hannah Arendt.

When you think of Ireland, you immediately see pictures of green, lush meadows with happy sheep, stone walls, picturesque historical walls and storm-swept Atlantic shores. But Ireland is more. Not least because of his open-hearted people, who may sometimes appear coarse and rough, but are sensitive beings at heart, with a penchant for sentimentality. This becomes immediately apparent when you have seen a sing-song in a pub, the devotion with which the Irish belt out old ballads who complain about the hard fate of their ancestors and how great their passion for telling old fairy tales and legends is. Ireland has changed a lot over the past few decades due to the economic upswing, and many Irish people and some foreigners today wistful think back to the good old days when their Ireland was still genuine and authentic. However, if you make a little effort, you can still find a lot of it today. "Unspoilt Ireland - People, Pictures & Legends" describes the country and encounters with its inhabitants, as the author has experienced on numerous trips from the 1970s to today and captured them with his camera and notepad.
