

The Three Billy Goats Gruff

The classic folktale of The Three Billy Goat's Gruff is retold for early readers. Little Billy Goat Gruff, Middle Billy Goat Gruff and Big Billy Goat Gruff want to cross the bridge to go up the mountain to get fat, but a troll who lives under the bridge wants to eat them up! The family of three billy goats make it safely over the bridge, but the troll meets his end in this traditional retelling. For grades 1-2, 24 pages.

One by one, the three billy goats gruff cross a bridge guarded by a hungry troll to get to the green pasture on the other side.

The fresh and lively narrative and imaginative drawings ensure that children can follow as you read to them, or try for themselves. The large format is perfect for show-and-tell reading.

The Three Billy Goats Gruff is part of the Jolly Phonics Readers Level 3 General Fiction series. In addition to the 42 letter sounds, and /y/ used for the /ee/ sound at the end of words like 'funny', Level 3 introduces the 'magic e' for spelling words with the long vowels, as in 'make', 'like', 'bone' and 'tune'. Tricky words are shown at the beginning of each book. Comprehension questions and discussion topics are provided at the end of each book. Also includes guidance for teachers and parents.
