Valley of Vision Remix is a collection of prayers and devotions adapted from "The Valley of Vision: A Collection of Puritan Prayers" that have been rewritten and refreshed in modern English by TG Melton. This particular volume of Valley of Vision Remix, focuses on praying to Our Triune God. So often in our prayers, we only focus on one particular person of the Trinity. In fact, we may have a practice of addressing God as "Father", or "Jesus", or "Holy Spirit." Certainly there is nothing wrong with this custom, however there is a danger in this habit as it may lead us to think of God as uni-personal, instead of tri-personal. When this happens we can subtly forget the robust and exclusively unique character of our God: That he is God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Three persons, but one God. One God, yet three persons. The prayers in this book engage with the mysterious Trinitarian nature of God, while acknowledging that even though he is fully present with us, he is also far beyond us. Hopefully, these truths will help us to pray with more intimacy and passion in worship of our Triune God; so that we will come to know the fullness of his heart, even when we cannot trace the direction of his hand; and so that we will more deeply experience the nature of his love, even when we cannot possibly fully comprehend the nature of his being.

Because we live in a broken, fallen world, the feeling of wanderer is easy to come by. And the broken world does not necessarily become easier for the one who becomes God's child. You have probably had at least one season (if not multiple seasons) where you felt as a "wanderer". You live and walk through life moment by moment, day by day, year by year and yet find that you're not sure where you're headed and feel like you carry your cross and struggle with life, alone. Yet all of this must find its end at the feet of the redeeming hope of God's truth. For the Christian, this feeling is deeper because he knows that, despite the unknown and uncertain life and future that stretches before him, he is not really walking through life aimless, helpless and directionless but rather being led and guided by the unseen God; the Father in Heaven. I have written this book to share with any and all those who feel like they're alone in their life and their walk after God. In my imperfect poetry and heart, I have sought to reflect and display this truth of God: That we have tangible hope (assurance) to have and hold in this life and keep us in our walk before Him. If you have seen the path before you as uncertain... If you have found yourself a lonely and struggling traveler through life... Or have felt yourself like a leaf being carried by an unseen wind... Then my book is for you. So grasp the Father's tender hand and let Him lead you through the shadows and light of your life...through His valley of vision.

Emanuel Swedenborg became best known for his book on the afterlife, Heaven and Hell. At 53, he entered into a spiritual phase in which he began to experience dreams and visions. His experiences culminated in a "spiritual awakening" in which he received a revelation that Jesus Christ had appointed him to write The Heavenly Doctrine to reform Christianity. The New Church, a new religious movement originally founded in 1787 and comprising several historically-related Christian denominations, reveres Swedenborg's writings as revelation.
